The menu will be as follows:

Starter: Sun blushed tomato and red onion tarte tatin with a rocket and parmesan salad

Main: Whisky braised short rib of beef, pomme puree, roasted shallot, confit savoy and braising liquor

Dessert: Chocolate boîte , hazelnut praline, salted caramel, chocolate cremeux and hazelnut crumb

Our principal guest and speaker will be Victoria Wallace, ex-Director General Of the Commonwealth War Graves Commission and currently Under Treasurer and Chief Executive at The Honourable Society of the Middle Temple

After taking a degree in law at Exeter University, Victoria Wallace joined the diplomatic service, serving in London, Thailand and Tanzania. In 2000 she was appointed Justices Chief Executive for the Sussex Magistrates' courts, before moving to the Leeds Castle Foundation where she was chief executive for ten years.

Since 2014 she has been the Director General of the Commonwealth War Graves Commission, leading the global team caring for the fallen of the two World Wars, with a broad portfolio of conservation, public engagement and education. She is just reaching the end of her term as the Honorary Secretary of the Association of Independent Museums and is also a Deputy Lieutenant of the County of Kent. She is married with two daughters, and enjoys travel, heritage, and the arts.
